**Hungarian Splendour:
Masterpieces
from the National Gallery in Budapest**

For the very first time across the Atlantic, and the only stop in North America, the Art Gallery of Hamilton proudly presents a selection of 75-works of Hungary's beloved nineteenth-century paintings from the National Gallery in Budapest. Works consist of those by internationally active Mihály Munkácsy (1844–1900), Miklós Barabás (1810–1898), Károly Markó (1822–1891), Károly Lotz (1833–1904) and Pál Synzei Merse (1845–1920). These treasured paintings echo the history and influences of 19th century Hungary: A country at the crossroads of the world -- where east, west, north and south intersect.

Through an opening address by the Art Gallery Curator, our group will gain an appreciation for the affinities between the style of painting in Hungary and that of the rest of Europe, as well as be introduced to unique aspects of Hungarian tradition. Later docents will give us a guided tour of the exhibit.
